Anaïs LF is a visual artist based in Normandy, France. With an academic background in Information and Communication Sciences, she transitioned from analyzing symbols to the visceral freedom of painting in 2018.







My practice is a study of movement, depth, and the raw energy of color. Working primarily in monochromatic blue, I explore the synergy between human gesture and physical matter.

As a granddaughter of cabinetmakers and tailors, I handcraft the monumental brushes I use to paint, treating them as extensions of my own body. My process is a sedimentation of layers ; a dialogue between pigment, climate, and time ; capturing the exact moment where chaos finds harmony.

Description: Created with 200 cm custom brushes, this piece eliminates all anecdotal details, leaving only the raw trace of a body in motion.







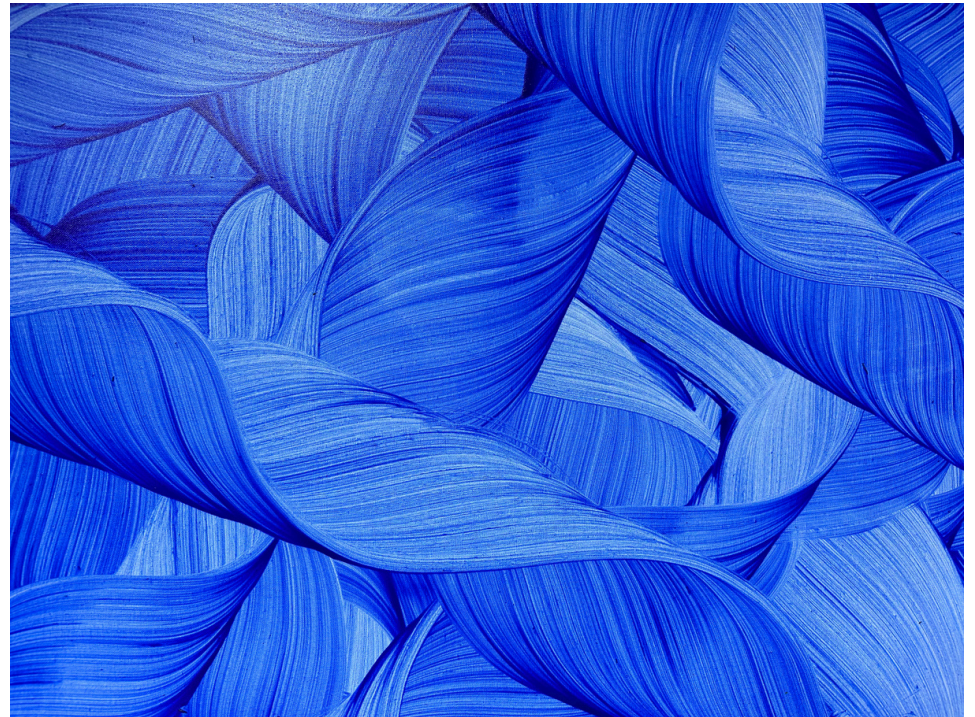
Les 2 grands Cobalt - Série les vagues bleues, 2026

Description: A synchronous dialogue between two 150 cm brushes. This twin-tool device imposes a physical distance that transforms the gesture into a four-handed corporal dialogue.





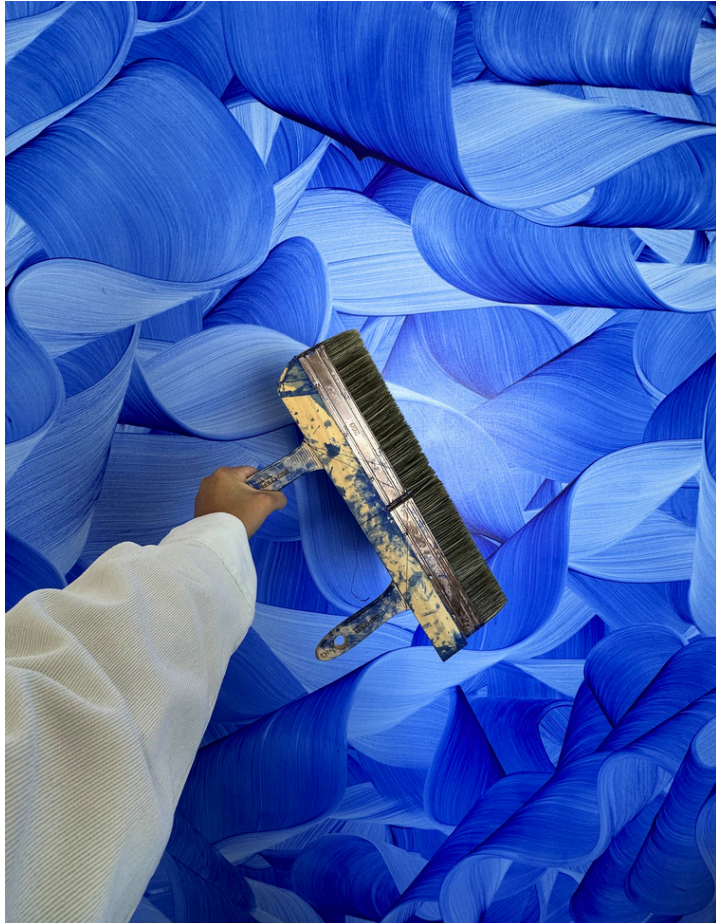
No Name - Les vagues bleues, 2026

Description: A hypnotic, monochromatic exploration of blue. This piece stands as the manifesto of my research into fluidity, texture, and light, balancing apparent chaos with underlying rigor.

The Architecture of Gesture: My work is inseparable from the tools I create. Each brush is a bespoke instrument designed for the specific scale of the canvas. By engineering these tools (ranging from 150 cm to 400 cm), I redefine the relationship between the painter's body, the space, and the surface.

Upcoming Research: Developing 1-meter precision tools to further modulate texture and impact.

The major challenge lies in the proportionality of the gesture's amplitude relative to the varying scales of the surface. To maintain a consistent visual rhythm and texture density, the length of the tool must be structurally indexed to the format of the work.

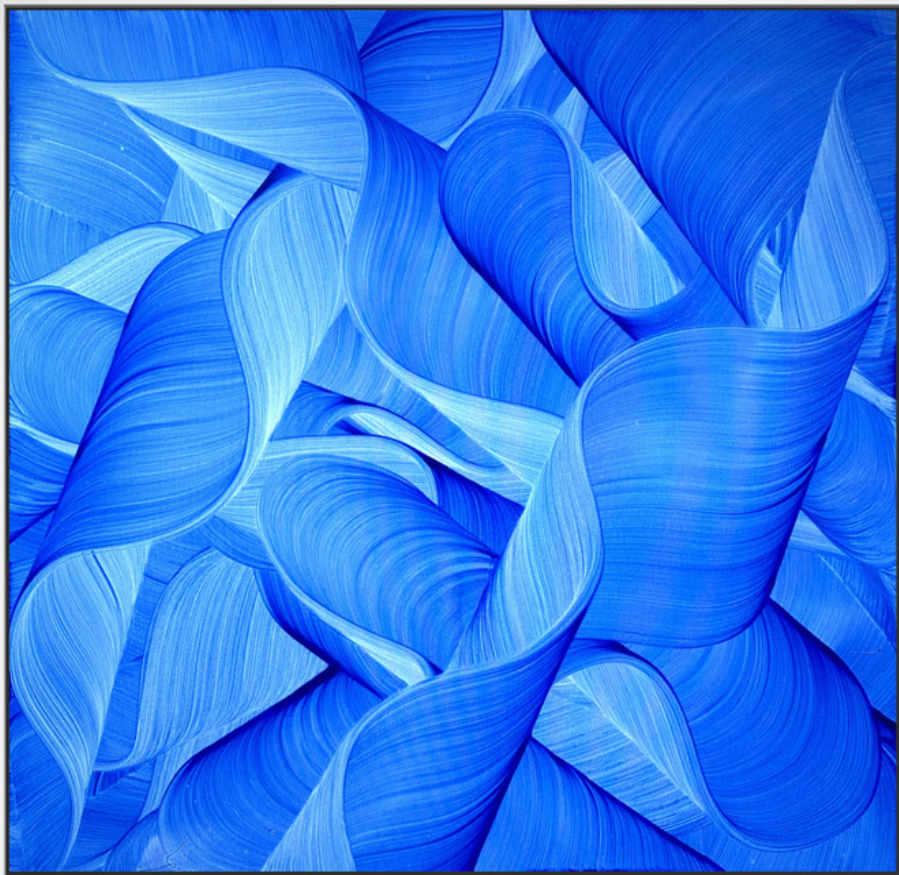
